5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Alabama

Peace Corps has educational partnerships with the University of Alabama at Birmingham, Alabama A&M University, Tuskegee University, and Troy University.

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Greater Birmingham Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs).

For nearly twenty years, the Greater Birmingham RPCVs have coordinated each with a local school or institution to work with students and others in conducting a world map mural project.

A profile by the Peace Corps featured the tremendous service provided by Alabama native Kenyatta Spiller. A graduate of Alabama State University, Spiller served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Botswana, and volunteered for a third year in Zambia. Spiller also did two tours as an Americorps Volunteer in Montgomery.

Alabama State Senator Arthur Orr, who has held office since 2006 and currently represents Morgan, Madison, and Limestone counties, served as a Peace Corps in Nepal from 1989-1991.
