## 5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Alaska

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Alaska Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) based in Anchorage, and the North Alaska Peace Corps Friends based in Fairbanks.

For the past 38 years during the third Thursday of each October, the Northern Alaska Peace Corps Friends have volunteered to organize a multi-ethnic group of community members during Fairbanks' International Friendship Day. The group has also volunteered during public radio/television pledge drives, and donated more than \$1,600 to Kiva for small loans to 65 recipients in 26 countries.
