Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) partnered with Community Health Centers of Arkansas (CHCA) during a ten month program to increase COVID-19 vaccinations and education in underserved communities.

Arkansas native and Malawi RPCV Dwayne Matthews has been recognized for his creative Peace Corps recruitment efforts, connecting with individuals at barber shops near Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

Former Arkansas State University president and University of Arkansas graduate Ross Pritchard, who died in 2020, was a regional director of Peace Corps programs in East Asia and the Pacific during the 1960's.
