5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Georgia

Georgia currently ranks 6th in the nation in sending current Peace Corps Volunteers overseas.

Peace Corps has educational partnerships with Emory University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia College and State University, Georgia Gwinnett College, Kennesaw State University, Georgia State University, Mercer University-Macon, Savannah State University, and the University of Georgia.

Past service projects of the Atlanta Area Returned Peace Corps Volunteers include volunteering with Trees Atlanta, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, New American pathways, and various food banks.

Alia Pharr, who served as a Peace Corps volunteer in El Salvador, is a journalist with the Atlanta Journal Constitution, covering taxation and infrastructure issues in the metro Atlanta region.

Two late Georgians are honored by the Peace Corps for their service. The Lillian Carter Award (recognizing exemplary volunteers over the age of 50) honors the former India volunteer who served from 1966–1968. Graduate school fellowship programs are named after former Senator Paul Coverdell, who served as Peace Corps director from 1989 until 1991.
