5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Maine

Among lesser populated states, Maine currently ranks tied for 6th in the nation, sending approximately 20 Peace Corps Volunteers overseas.

The Peace Corps has an educational partnership through its Coverdell Fellows program with the University of Maine School of Social Work.

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Maine Peace Corps Association. The group has an active Facebook social media presence with 500 members, an e-newsletter, and hosts social gatherings like book club nights and regular monthly meetups.

Maine Secretary of State Shenna Bellows was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Panama from 1999-2001. Sherry Russell is currently serving as the Peace Corps Country Director in Nepal. She previously worked as the Peace Corps Country Director in Samoa.

The 54 acre Goose River Peace Corps Preserve (near Waldoboro) was donated in 2001 to the Medomak Valley Land Trust by a group of friends who met each other while serving with the Peace Corps in Turkey.
