## 5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Maryland

Maryland currently ranks 7th in the nation, with more than 100 citizens serving as Peace Corps Volunteers overseas. Historically, Maryland ranks 14th in the nation in terms of the number of volunteers sent by states since 1961.

The Peace Corps has educational partnerships with six Maryland universities: The University of Maryland-College Park, the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, the University of Maryland-Baltimore, Johns Hopkins University, Morgan State University, and Notre Dame of Maryland University.

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include The Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) of Greater Washington, which includes many Peace Corps community members from Maryland's DC suburbs.
