5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Pennsylvania

Pennsylvania currently ranks 10th in the nation sending more than 100 Peace Corps Volunteers overseas. Historically, Pennsylvania ranks 9th in the nation in sending volunteers overseas since 1961.

Peace Corps has educational partnerships with a dozen colleges and universities: Arcadia University, Cheyney University, Moravian University, Shippensburg University, Ursinus College, Carnegie Mellon University, Drexel University, Duguesne University, Penn State University, Seton Hill University, University of Pennsylvania, and University of Pittsburgh.

Pennsylvania is home to four National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups: the Philadelphia Area Peace Corps Association, the Pittsburgh Area Peace Corps Association, the Mountain Laurel Returned Peace Corps Volunteers of Northeast Pennsylvania, and the South Central Pennsylvania Peace Corps Association.

Members of the Pittsburgh Area Peace Corps Association organize volunteering at Global Links, a medical relief and development organization which promotes environmental and health care improvements in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Lisa Powers serves as Chief Operations Officer with the Girl Scouts in the Heart of Pennsylvania (GSHPA). Powers previously worked 16 years with the Peace Corps.
