5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in South Dakota

Ron Tschetter, the 17th director of the Peace Corps (under President George W. Bush), is a resident of Rapid City. Ron and his wife Nancy served as Peace Corps Volunteers in India from 1966-1968.

Returned Peace Corps Volunteer (RPCV) and former state legislator Tom Katus (Tanzania 1961-63) is active in Rapid City, supporting service and connecting members of the local Peace Corps community with Americorps and Rotary members.

Michael Saba, a former member of the South Dakota House of Representatives, served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Malaysia from 1965-1967.

In 2017, after serving twenty years as South Dakota's State Epidemiologist, Dr. Lon Kightlinger took his talents to Madagascar, where he served our nation as a Peace Corps Volunteer.

Since 1988, individual Returned Peace Corps Volunteers and National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups have purchased and sold Peace Corps international calendars. Proceeds have generated well over \$2 Million in charitable giving for worthy causes in the U.S. and around the world.
