5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Vermont

Among lesser populated states, Vermont currently ranks tied for 6th in the nation, sending approximately 20 Peace Corps Volunteers overseas.

Among medium colleges and universities, the University of Vermont historically ranks 3rd in the nation, sending more than 800 volunteers overseas. Among small colleges and universities, Middlebury College ranked 5th in the nation, sending more than 400 volunteers overseas.

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Green Mountain Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs).

In August 2022, a new State Division for Historic Preservation marker was dedicated at World Learning in Brattleboro, to recognize the site as a primary training center in the early years of the Peace Corps.

2024 marked the 26th year that the Green Mountain RPCVs collected used bikes and sewing machines in Montpelier and Burlington. The donation of 241 bikes means the group surpassed 5,000 bike donations mark over time. 96 sewing machines were also donated.
